In 2018, VATE shared a conversation with you about the proposed literacy test for VCE students. At this meeting, members of the VATE Council shared ideas, opinions regarding the benefits and limitations of a literacy test at VCE, and heard more from you about the proposal which at that stage had not been finalised. We also put out a survey to all our members and put together a report, a copy of which was sent to you.

VATE is very interested to continue to be part of the discussion, planning and implementation of the proposed VCE literacy test. We feel, as representatives of English teachers across the state, it is important we maintain an open dialogue with VCAA regarding this initiative.
