Cate Kennedy is an award-winning novelist, short-story writer and poet. Her novel, *The World Beneath*, won the People's Choice Award in the NSW Premier's Literary Awards in 2010. *Dark Roots*, her debut short-story collection, was shortlisted for the Steele Rudd Award in the Queensland Premier's Literary Awards and for the Australian Literature Society Gold Medal. Based on a secluded bend of the Broken River in north-east Victoria, Kennedy is also a short fiction teacher, mentor, editor and judge.
