- 1. *Darius the Great* duology by Adib Korran (tackles cultural dislocation & the mixed identity very well, queer + mental health rep!)
- 2. Australia Day by Stan Grant
- 3. Wild Seed by Octavia Butler → subtle characterisation + feminist text
- 4. the Growing Up in Australia series (*Growing up Aboriginal in Australia* + *Growing up African in Australia*)
- 5. Cemetery Boys by Aiden Thomas (trans, not being accepted by family/being afraid of their perception)
- 6. *Persepolis* by Marjane Satrapi (graphic memoir about growing up, translated, adapted into film)
- 7. They Called Us Enemy by George Takei (graphic memoir, Japanese American internment camps in WWII)
- 8. A Small Place by Jamaica Kincaid (tourism & its impact on Antigua, can extrapolate to other places. I studied this in uni!)
- 9. *I Am Not Sidney Poitier* by Percival Everett (FUNNY, turns a bunch of movies and their tropes on their head. Also studied this at uni!)
- 10. The Hate U Give by Angie Thomas
- 11. The Hate Race by Maxine Beneba Clarke (memoir about growing up Black in white Aus)
- 12. Crying in H Mart by Michelle Zauner (memoir, mixed, famous author aka the singer from Japanese Breakfast → might pique some interests)
- 13. How We Disappeared by Jing Lee (CW: WAR CRIMES)
- 14. *Dear Martin* by Nic Stone (police brutality in the US, very viscerally makes you understand how unsafe Black people are in their daily lives)
- 15. Lonely Castle in the Mirror by Mizuki Tsujimura (isn't about racism, important not to just read things about racism. Great anxiety rep)
- 16. One Hundred Days by Alice Pung (very Melbournian, teen pregnancy, council flats, comes out in June!)
- 17. The Henna Wars (sapphic + cultural appropriation)

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
