

(human) Being Anthology Application and Consent Form

'What happens when people feel that they are not in charge of their stories either locally, or in a globalised world, is alienation. This is the problem of censoring, of silencing, amputating parts of the story, or having stories stolen, or writing official scripts, or having your story told on other people's terms.

(human) Being is VATE's response - to fly higher and to be braver.

Creating an Australia free from discrimination is a job for everyone. This series will move stories from the margins to the centre. It will be an act of visibility and solidarity and a counterprogram to the noise. It will place the human voice at the centre – to fight mis/disinformation through narrative.

This inaugural edition of **(human) Being** amplifies LGBTQIA+ voices by bringing together student and teacher writing with commissioned contributions from established authors. Importantly, it will also include factual information to combat mis/disinformation. Supported by mentorship and paired with a practical teacher resource, the project aims to strengthen inclusive practice in schools, foster belonging, and celebrate queer storytelling.

(human) Being is an initiative of VATE (Victorian Association for the Teaching of English). VATE is a not-for-profit organisation which supports the teaching of secondary English in Victoria through advocacy, publications and resources, and professional learning.

This VATE initiative is supported by **Karys McEwen** (author editor), **Will Kostakis** (author ambassador), and **Ange Crawford**, **Ernest Price** and **Jes Layton** (commissioned writers).

Invitation to students

Years 7-12 Victorian students are invited to contribute to the (human) Being anthology.

This will involve the following:

- Submission of a piece of original writing.
- In Term 2, students contributing to **(human) Being** will be invited to take part in a live, one-hour online workshop with the anthology's authors and author-editor. Held during school hours via Zoom, these sessions will give young writers the chance to ask questions, explore ideas of identity and representation, and receive guidance on shaping their own pieces for publication. Each workshop will be supported by VATE staff, including Project Officer Karys McEwen, and we request that a teacher be present for the duration of the session. Designed to be welcoming, inclusive, and creatively energising, this workshop aims to empower students to tell their stories with clarity, confidence, and care.

- Submission of draft work Thursday 2 April 2026.
- Writing workshops Term 2 2026.
- Final work submitted Friday 5 June 2026.
- Anthology launched Week 1, Term 3 2026.

Student writing

Students can let VATE know whether they want their submission to be:

- **Anonymous**: Student's name and school will **not** be published with their writing in the **(human) Being** anthology.
- **Identified**: Student's name and school **will be** included with the publication of their writing in the **(human) Being** anthology.
- **Identified**: Student's name (only) **will be** included with the publication of their writing in the **(human) Being** anthology.

Terms and conditions

- Publication and access: The (human) Being anthology will be published on the VATE website
 and emailed to all VATE members. It will be accessible on the VATE website in the member area.
 Applicants agree to VATE using their work in the anthology teaching and learning material and
 all related activities. VATE sees this publication as an act of solidarity and as such it may be
 circulated to state and territory English teaching associations via our national association AATE
 and shared with international English teaching associations. A copy of the anthology will be
 shared with each contributor.
- **Personal information**: Any information collected about participating students will only be used for purposes relating to the **(human) Being** project and will be protected in compliance with privacy laws.
- Reporting obligations: If anything in students' writing or participation in workshops indicates that a participating student or another student may be at risk of harm, the organisers of (human) Being may report this information to relevant authorities as per mandatory reporting requirements and in line with Victorian Child Safe Standards (2022).
- **Copyright**: Copyright of the **(human) Being** anthology (publication and related material) remains with VATE. Individuals retain copyright ownership of their respective pieces of work.
- **Change of mind**: Participating students reserve the right to withdraw their writing prior to the Term 3 2026 publication date.
- **Acceptance**: All works submitted will be reviewed by the project team. Only successful applicants will participate in the author workshops and have their work published in the anthology.

- Entries must be **original** and created **without** the use of Al.
- Submit entries as .docx or .doc files (no PDFs or cloud links).
- Use 12pt Arial font, double spaced.
